NASHVILLE AUTHOR BASES FOURTH BOOK ON TENNESSEE SHERIFF'S MURDER

Antioch resident Marie-Nicole Ryan has based her September 25th release, *Too Good To Be True* (\$12.50, Samhain Publishing, Ltd.), on a real-life 2002 incident in Tennessee in which a newly elected sheriff was murdered in his own driveway.

"This event sparked my imagination," says Ryan. "I used the idea of a sheriff's murder as the starting point for my story. The rest of the story is entirely fiction. *Too Good To Be True* is about a Metro. Nashville homicide detective who comes home to the fictional Clinton County to serve out the rest of her murdered father's term and find the person responsible for his death. What happens after that is a story of betrayal, secrets, and family drama. Add to that mix, falling in love with the undercover DEA agent who has been sent to investigate her."

Ms. Ryan is a long-time member of Romance Writers of America®, Music City Romance Writers, and Kiss of Death, the RWA Mystery/Suspense chapter. She served two years as the editor of MCRW's newsletter from 2005 to 2007. She's a native of Henderson, KY, but she's lived in Tennessee so long she considers herself a native Tennessean. A full-time writer, Ryan retired from her day job as a case manager at Centennial Medical Center last fall.
